About WoolSafe

In 1999 The WoolSafe Organisation launched an accreditation scheme for professional carpet cleaning companies, called the WoolSafe Service Provider programme, to counter unqualified cleaners who give the carpet cleaning industry a bad name.



Independent carpet cleaners, franchisees and in-house carpet cleaning contractors can become WoolSafe Service Providers (visit www.woolsafe.org/cleanerhowto How Do I become an Approved Company).

The WoolSafe Service Provider programme is currently operational in Great Britain, Ireland, The United States of America, Australia, Greece and Germany.

Please note - IICRC certified technicians will earn CEC credits on completion of any WoolSafe course, regardless whether they decide to join the WoolSafe Service Provider network or not.

- Manufacture and characteristics of 100% wool and wool-rich carpets and rugs
- Cleaning and maintenance techniques specific to wool and wool-rich carpets and rugs
- WoolSafe approval programme for carpet and upholstery cleaning and protection products
- WoolSafe approved products: how and why they are selected, and why you should use them
- Common problems with wool floor coverings and how to deal with them

Training sessions will begin at 09.30 hrs and finish at approx. 16.30 hrs. A light lunch and refreshments during the day will be available at the venue and are included in the fee.

A course manual and an 'open book' examination paper will be issued to every candidate at the end of the training course. Completed exams must be returned to The WoolSafe Organisation for adjudication within one month. The minimum standard required is 80% for qualification as a WoolSafe Certified Operator and 75% as a Registered Technician / Operative.



Candidates who achieve this mark will be invited to become members. Those that meet the membership requirements will, upon payment of the registration and membership fees, be registered, listed and issued with the relevant Certificate.

Carpet Complaint Investigation Course for Inspectors

This 2-day course is presented by Dr Eric M Brown of Cleaning Research International, who has been a carpet inspector for more than 30 years, during which time he has inspected hundreds of installations, both residential (domestic) and commercial (contract). A significant number of claims have gone to Court, where Dr Brown has acted as an expert witness.

First day - Theory

The first day is concerned with:

- o the theoretical aspects of carpet faults
- an introduction to certain fundamentals of textile technology and carpet manufacture
- explanations of different generic types of fault, including: pile reversal and other texture changes colour changes, its causes and possible remedies spots, streaks and stripes uneven and premature wear delamination and other backing problems odours

Second day - Practice

The second day of instruction involves:

- o Practical investigative work, including -
- A series of simple chemical and physical tests that can be used to explain the cause of a fault.
- o More elaborate tests that can be carried out in a properly equipped textile testing laboratory.
- o Problem assessment and fault analysis
- o Report writing

Terms and Conditions for Booking *WoolSafe Training Courses

1. Public Training Courses and Prices

1.1 The details of the course content and the prices are correct at the time of publication, but are subject to change without notice.

1.2 The cost of optional overnight accommodation is not included in the course fees.

1.3 WoolSafe reserves the right to cancel or reschedule courses without penalty or liability if there are bookings which it deems to be insufficient, or for reasons outside its control. WoolSafe will try to notify participants as soon as reasonably possible if a course has to be cancelled.

1.4 Payment is due on receipt of invoice without any deductions including, but not limited to, bank charges. Time of payment shall be of the essence and accordingly WoolSafe may treat failure to pay any of its invoices on time as a repudiation of the contract on your part and may also treat itself as discharged from its own contractual obligations.

2. Cancellation Policy

2.1 In respect of cancellation by WoolSafe, a full refund will be given.

2.2 WoolSafe reserves the right to charge the full course fee for any cancellation by a participant for any reason within 10 days of the start of the training course. If between10-21 days notice is given, we reserve the right to charge 50% of the course fee. General
